# Town and parish council update

Latest information for town and parish councils in Lincolnshire

Welcome to the June issue of your Town and Parish Council Newsletter.

You can find updates on the flooding reports, as well as our rights of way survey, carers support, the good citizens award and online fraud.

## Flooding reports update

We are continuing to investigate the causes and factors of flooding across Lincolnshire following Storm Babet and Storm Henk. Whilst the main focus of the investigations is on properties that have been internally flooded, data and evidence has also been gathered in relation to flooded roads and agricultural land. In addition, over 600 'near miss' reports have been received.

We are still on track to publish all of these reports by the end of August 2024. These will be published on **our website**, as soon as they become available.



# **Rights of Way**

The council manages Lincolnshire's public rights of way network – footpaths, bypasses and byways that the public can use to explore our county.

We have an Improvement Plan which is now due to be refreshed and we want to update our understanding of the different people who use the network and their needs. We'd like to know what you believe the network and its users need.

At this stage we don't want to gather feedback about specific routes, or to hear from absolutely everyone

but what you tell us as councils will help set strategic and aspirational priorities in the next 10-year draft plan. We'll ask the public and other stakeholders about the draft plan once it's developed.

The survey is on <u>Let's talk Lincolnshire</u> until 28 July and takes around five minutes to complete. Before taking the survey, please review the previous <u>plan</u>.

## Support for carers

Unpaid care is an issue that can impact us all and there are currently 5.7 million unpaid carers in the UK.

Our research from Carers Week 2021 estimates that there are 88,000 carers in Lincolnshire alone.

However, many more people may not identify as or even realise they are carers, which can result in a high proportion of carers going without support. But it's important to know that if you are a carer, you are not alone. There is a range of support out there, and you shouldn't wait until it's too late to access that support before you find yourself in difficulty.

### Beware of online investment fraud

The FCA is warning of an increased risk of online investment fraud and have explained how to spot this:

- 1. You see ads within your social media feeds, sometimes celebrity endorsed, offering high returns on investments
- 2. You're contacted out of the blue by phone, email or social media about an investment opportunity
- 3. You may be offered a high return on your investment with apparently little or no risk
- 4. You're told the investment opportunity is exclusive to you, or are pressurised into making a decision with no time for consideration
- 5. Criminals set up cloned websites purporting to be legitimate investment firms and may even send out paperwork with official branding to add credibility to their scams.
