

Residents across Lincolnshire will go to the polls on Thursday 1 May to elect a mayor of Greater Lincolnshire and their representatives on Lincolnshire County Council.

A booklet containing information about the candidates standing in the first Greater Lincolnshire Combined County Authority Mayoral election has been delivered to everyone eligible to vote in the area.

Publishing and delivering this information is a government requirement for the Mayoral elections.

- how well PRoW provide for exercise and other forms of outdoor recreation and enable people to enjoy the area
- PRoW accessibility to people who are blind or partially sighted and those with mobility problems

### Free events to help parents support children to stay safe online

A series of free events have been organised giving parents and carers the opportunity to get their questions answered on a raft of online safety issues, including age-appropriate apps, online trends, parental controls, social media, and more.

The online events will be hosted by Lincolnshire County Council's Stay Safe team, who in the last academic year have delivered hands on workshops to 50,000 children aged between seven and 18 – helping them develop the skills they need to navigate the online world safely.
